Grande Prairie Forklift License - Within North America, obtaining forklift certification or a forklift license involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over certification, training and license for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators may get a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machine which is designed along with different options, such as sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and various types and sizes to meet the industrial requirements of employees. Operator training programs are often individualized to deal with the certain uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck in a warehouse surroundings will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck within a shipyard. The variety of forklifts and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machinery and businesses. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to concentrate on particular course requirements but instead on the results of individual training programs.

On the job training which is offered by the employer is the most common form of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who offers this method of certification is needed to offer practical training and classroom sessions on equipment at their place of work. Employers can choose to train workers on each type of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The course incorporates lift truck operation procedures, lift truck maintenance, safety measures and company rules. Topics specific to the worksite, like dangerous conditions or materials, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally needs an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Obtaining a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to run a forklift for that specific employer only.

The most significant factor of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one kind of machinery to another. Safety issues differ from employer to employer, and from industry to industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in marine and offshore uses.
